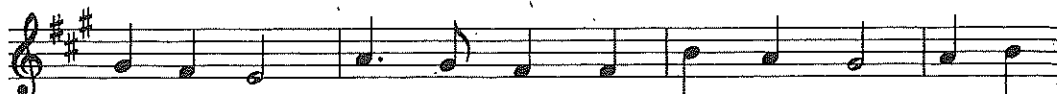
Prayer for Spiritual Communion

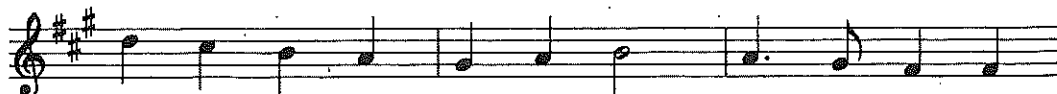
